

Evidence of Homeownership on Tribal or Individually Held Trust Land

A. Evidence of homeownership on tribal or individually held trust lands may be any of the following:

- i. Deed or quitclaim deed;
- ii. Land Assignment (also known as a homesite lease on the Navajo Nation) of tribal trust lands;
- iii. Residential lease or sublease of tribal trust lands;
- iv. Allotment of trust lands;
- v. Leasehold mortgage;
- vi. Grazing permit;
- vii. A signed statement or resolution from a Tribe, Indian Housing Authority (IHA), or Tribally Designated Housing Entity (TDHE) stating or showing that an applicant has made all required housing payments under a lease purchase agreement with the Tribe, IHA or TDHE, and that there are title issues that require clearing prior to the applicant receiving a deed or quitclaim deed.
- viii. A signed statement from a court, Court Order, or court record showing that the applicant is the heir or devisee of any of the above.
